Your Impact in 2025

This year, University Hospital Foundation secured over \$4,000,000 to ensure exceptional care for our community.

Emergency Medicine & Trauma

Our expanded Emergency Department now better accommodates the 100,000 patients we see each year with greater privacy, updated technology, and faster access to life-saving care. Our Emergency Clothing Closet supported 3,500 patients, and trauma education programs reached more than 5,000 people.



Center for Advanced Liver Disease and Transplant

University Hospital continues to rank among the nation's best for three-year liver transplant survival, reflecting the dedication and expertise of our clinical teams. Construction is underway on a new, consolidated Center for Advanced Liver Disease & Transplant, bringing all services under one roof to improve access, coordination, and the patient experience. The Center is slated to open in early 2026.

Maternal & Child Health

Maternal and child health programs continue to grow, with enhanced prenatal support, strengthened NICU services, and family-centered initiatives providing resources directly to patients, ensuring parents and children receive the care and comfort they need.



Breast Cancer Screening & Community Outreach

Early detection of breast cancer is growing across Newark. Our mobile mammography program screened nearly 3,000 women in its first year, helping catch breast cancer earlier and reduce the number of late-stage diagnoses in our community.



Hybrid Operating Room

Planning continues for a new, state-of-the-art operating room that integrates advanced imaging directly into the surgical suite. This space will let surgeons diagnose, image, and treat patients without moving between rooms, improving precision, reducing procedure times, and creating a safer, more seamless patient experience.

Workforce Development

Training and education opportunities allow our employees and community to grow and advance within University Hospital, strengthening our workforce and ability to care for our patients. Through our partnership with West Side High School, students gain hands-on exposure to healthcare professions through internships and rotations.

When Every Second Counts, Your Support Makes the Difference

Severe injuries often occur suddenly, with no warning — the result of a car crash, a bad fall, a natural disaster, and more. Behind every traumatic injury is a journey: a loved one anxiously awaiting a prognosis, a child in critical care, a community counting on our ability to respond swiftly. When the unthinkable happens, University Hospital is always ready.



The Eric Muñoz Trauma Center at University Hospital is the only state-certified Level 1 Trauma Center in Northern New Jersey and the busiest center in the state, caring for more than 5,800 patients in 2024 alone. As a Level 1 Trauma Center, UH provides the most advanced care for the region's most complex cases, with specialists available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, across every clinical service.

You make this possible. Philanthropic dollars fuel innovation at UH, ensuring our Trauma Center is both a leader in patient outcomes and a cornerstone for education and innovation. As an academic medical center, we take great care to invest money into programs that have the greatest impact, well beyond our initial investment. A strong example is training the next generation of trauma providers to advance life-saving care across New Jersey and beyond.

Launched in 2022 with support from The Healthcare Foundation of New Jersey, University Hospital's Trauma Education and Simulation Program continues to make a meaningful impact today. Doctors, nurses, and first responders leverage simulation technology to replicate real-world emergencies, rotating through adult, pediatric, and disaster scenarios, so clinicians can continue to strengthen critical skills in advanced trauma life support, trauma nursing, trauma-informed care, and patient communication.

What began as a grant-funded initiative has become a model for continuous learning and clinical excellence.

Beyond treating physical injuries, UH supports patients and families through our Trauma Recovery Center, survivorship programs, and spiritual care services because we know trauma affects every aspect of a person's well-being. These programs help patients rebuild their lives long after they leave the hospital by providing emotional support, counseling, and a sense of community.

"I was hit by an SUV and suffered catastrophic injuries requiring multiple surgeries and an extended hospitalization. If it were not for the dedicated trauma physicians, orthopedic surgeons, neurologists, and nurses at UH, I would not be here. Thanks to them, I was able to go home in 6 months and return to work in 9 months. I will always be indebted to these professionals."

Healthy Beginnings, Brighter Futures

Every day at University Hospital, our teams work to ensure that every mother and child in the Newark region have access to compassionate care, health education, and the support they need to thrive.

We know that health doesn't begin or end at the doctor's office. It's shaped by our homes, schools, workplaces, and neighborhoods. Here, in Newark, 63% of children live in low-income households, and many more families face challenges to receiving the care and resources they need to build healthier lives. That's why University Hospital reaches beyond its walls to break down barriers in the community and connect families to healthcare.

Thanks to the unwavering commitment of our supporters, including the Roots & Wings Foundation, which has invested more than \$2 million since 2022, we provide expectant moms and their babies with the resources they need to stay healthy long after they leave our care.


Because of you, we're able to provide in-depth, practical patient education that gives parents and caregivers the confidence and knowledge they need from day one. Families learn about safe car seat use, breastfeeding, and infant care — everyday skills that make a lasting difference.

In our Centering Pregnancy and Centering Parenting programs, expectant and new mothers learn from healthcare providers and one another, creating a supportive environment that builds healthier habits for the whole family.

For parents who cannot afford a car seat, we provide one at no cost, along with hands-on demonstrations from Certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians to ensure every baby rides home safely.



As a nationally designated “Baby-Friendly Hospital”, we uphold the highest standards for mother-baby care related to infant feeding. Our lactation consultants offer ongoing guidance, and mothers returning to work can get electric breast pumps. This may seem simple, but it makes a profound impact to ensure newborns receive ideal nutrition that supports growth, boosts their immune system, and improves long-term health outcomes.



Celebrating Excellence: Toast & Tribute Fuels Our Mission



We were proud to honor University Hospital's Cardiology and Cardiothoracic Surgery Divisions at this year's Toast & Tribute. Led by Drs. Alfonso Waller and Justin Sambol, this extraordinary team delivers life-saving, compassionate care to a community disproportionately affected by heart disease.

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in New Jersey, and Newark citizens face far higher rates of high blood pressure, obesity, heart disease, and stroke. University Hospital's cardiac team meets this urgent need with advanced, evidence-based treatments — from managing complex conditions to performing intricate bypass, valve, and minimally invasive procedures.

This team has pioneered major advances, including the nation's first use of smartphone technology to treat heart attack patients and New Jersey's first use of leadless pacemakers. They also hold 15 years of Advanced Heart Failure certification (with Distinction) and accreditation for noninvasive cardiac imaging.

Behind these achievements is an integrated team of clinicians and staff working seamlessly across clinics, cath labs, ORs, and diagnostic suites. Thank you to everyone who joined us in celebrating their impact.

Teed Up for Impact: Reflecting on the Golf Classic

University Hospital Foundation's 2025 Golf Classic was held on September 29 at Canoe Brook Country Club in Summit, New Jersey, raising a record-breaking \$425,000 to support a new state-of-the-art hybrid operating room. This integrated space will allow surgeons to perform imaging, diagnostics, and complex procedures in a single room, improving surgical accuracy, reducing procedure times, and enhancing patient outcomes.

Dan joined the golf committee in 2023 and quickly brought new energy, helping secure sponsors and foursomes and playing a key role in making this year's event the most successful in its 12-year history. 

When a devastating workplace accident left Trudi Johnson's foot crushed and severed by a forklift, she arrived at University Hospital terrified of what she might lose.

From the moment she entered the Emergency Department, the team sprang into action, making sure she felt cared for, supported, and heard. She particularly remembers her physician's honesty, which helped her feel informed and reassured during a frightening time. The emergency and podiatry teams' quick response, she says, saved her foot. "If I hadn't been taken there, I know my foot would be gone, or worse, by now."



Trudi's recovery journey embodies the strength and resilience of our patients and community. She overcame immense challenges, regained her ability to walk and reclaimed her independence. Grateful for the exceptional care that preserved her mobility, Trudi now gives back as a donor, ensuring others facing traumatic injuries receive the same life-saving, multi-disciplinary support she did.


